## Supervisor Report...

With the election season finally over, we welcome a new board member to the Township and also bid a long-time board member goodbye.

We congratulate Eileen Brege for winning the election this November. Her term will start on November 20, 2016. The board welcomes her and we look forward to her input on issues in Belknap Township.

Eileen takes over for long-time board member Harlow Hardies. Harlow served Belknap Township for 32 years. We wish him the best and thank him for his excellent service to the Township. Harlow was a valuable asset to the Township, it's residents, and taxpayers. His knowledge and dedication will be missed.

In other news, the Fire Board millage renewal passed on the November ballot. This millage will continue to allow the department to provide fire protection services and properly outfit the department with the necessary supplies and equipment needed. Also, the department is planning to construct a new fire hall. This has been a long-term plan of the department and it is very much needed. We are currently renting from the City of Rogers City and we are out of space. The tentative location for the new hall is in the RC industrial park.

Belknap Township is part of an authority for fire protection and first responder service. The authority members also include Bismarck Twp, Moltke Twp, Rogers Twp, and the City of Rogers City.

News on Roads: Our last project was S. Rogers Rd. With that complete, the board will start to look at new projects as we build more funds. The Township Road Millage generates about \$23,000/year and helps pay for special road projects. The average reconstruction project may cost over \$200,000 per mile and the average seal coat project can run over \$18,000. Without the voter's continued support of the Township Road Millage, these projects would not be possible.
